A type specimen is a publication that shows the range of a particular typeface in use. Printers and typographers have produced type specimens for hundreds of years.

• explore effective uses of typographic content to establish hierarchy and reinforce the clarity and organization of typographic content

• gain a historical perspective into the development and evolution of type, its uses throughout history and how it may be utilized effectively to communicate a central idea or theme

• explore the dynamic aspects of typographic design

through experimental layout

• understand the subtle characteristics of letterform design

• specimen poster: must work aesthetically with your leaflet, this can be more expressive/experimental (at least 3 levels of hierarchy)
